

Volunteer Survey



Help Us Help constantly strives to improve its programming and volunteer experience. In the fall of 2021, Help Us Help conducted a Volunteer Survey to collect feedback from both our volunteers and donors. Results from the survey were compiled and presented to the Children and Scholars Committee to help quide future initiatives.

CHILDREN

Winter Camp 2021 Replacement

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and to help keep everyone healthy and safe during the 2020-2021 holiday season, Help Us Help led an alternative 2021 Winter Camp Program: "The Spirit of an Unusual Christmas". Help Us Help's scholars, alumni, volunteers, and staff provided humanitarian aid and support to 1000 children who spent the winter holidays within institutional care in Ukraine. In addition, the alternative program provided support to 100 families previously assisted by the COVID-19 Children's Relief Initiative.

Easter Workshop

Help Us Help provided children living in Ukraine's orphanages and residential institutions with workshop materials to learn about what the symbols and colours on traditional Ukrainian Easter Eggs (Pysanky) represent. The children additionally had the opportunity to design and colour in their own Pysanka creation!

Within Canada, Help Us Help volunteers participated in a Social Media "Easter Challenge" by posting their 2021 Pysanky online!



COVID-19 Relief Initiative

During the pandemic, children were moved from residential institutions in Ukraine to their biological family homes. Help Us Help partnered with the Ukrainian Canadian Congress, Canada Ukraine Foundation, and Meest to deliver aid to vulnerable families identified by the Zhytomyr Regional Center of Social Services for Families with Children and Youth. Notably, after the termination of the initiative, 147 children assisted by the initiative remained with their biological families and out of institutional care.



Humanitarian Aid Delivery

Prior to the Pandemic, Help Us Help had collected non-monetary donations for Summer camp. In 2021, Help Us Help redirected this aid (149 boxes weighing 2,713 kg), with the support of Meest Corporation Inc., to vulnerable groups in Ukraine. The aid was delivered to 11 Social Service Centres in Zhytomyr, Help Us Help program participants, and the Charitable Fund "Misto Dobra". In total, 89 families and 219 children benefited.



Baby Care Initiative

Help Us Help delivers new and gently-used baby items to expecting families in-need in Ukraine. The parcels contain humanitarian aid, clothing, educational materials as well as any additional items that can help curb the costs that are associated with having a child. In 2021, 65 parcels (1500 kg) were delivered to Help Us Help Alumni.







The Buddy Program

Launched May 2020, Help Us Help's Buddy Program was developed in an effort to provide a reliable point of social connection during a time of "social isolation". The Buddy Program involved 42 of the charity's past and present scholars in Ukraine and 32 Help Us Help volunteers from across North America. The Buddy Program continued until the summer of 2021, under the leadership of volunteers Taisa Mysakowec and Lily Potoczny.



2021 - 2022 Scholars

Help Us Help staff and two guests - John Shmorhun and psychologist Tetianna Sirenko - conducted interviews to select the incoming scholars. In October 2021, 52 individuals were selected to participate in the Scholars Program! Of these, 20 are named "Temerty Scholars" as they are supported by the Temerty Scholarship Fund. In total, Help Us Help welcomed 26 new Scholars to join the 28 continuing. This includes participants of Help Us Help's new initiative, "We are Capable" (page 14). Help Us Help is honoured to be able to support so many young Ukrainian students in their educational careers and professional development thanks to our donors.

Online Seminars

In the 2020-2021 school year, Help Us Help hosted 11 online seminars for Scholars and alumni. Several were interactive and focused on team-work and communication. Topics included health and wellness, job search, resume building and career guidance.







Mental Health Hub

Help Us Help's Mental Health Hub was established in 2021 to provide monthly group mental health workshops and individual sessions to any current Help Us Help Scholar or alumni. This program teaches Scholars the value of mental health and provides the necessary support for these young adults. The Mental Health Hub is run by two professionally trained psychologists in Ukraine, Tetiana Sirenko and Lubava Kazmirchuk.

Lumos Conference

Three of our Scholars - Kyrylo Nevdoha, Alina Hiba, and Volodymyr Stepanov - have joined the Lumos Research Committee founded by J.K. Rowling. In October 2021, they participated in a conference where they spoke about their research on the current state of children growing up within Ukraine's residential institution system. This was an amazing learning opportunity for Scholars, and allowed them to network with various research committees around the world.



Scholars Retreat

To kick off the 2021-2022 "Scholars" Program, the students attended their first retreat in Kyiv, where they participated in workshops, got acquainted with the program and its participants, and went on various tours around the city. This was a great opportunity for past and present scholars to meet and discuss their experiences with the Help Us Help community.

Importantly, after over a year of virtual gatherings, the students were able to meet each other, the Help Us Help staff and volunteers in-person



VETERANS

Two Mobile Support Service Vehicles

In 2021, Help Us Help provided Veteran Hub with the keys to two vehicles that are used as an integral part of the Veteran Reintegration Program in the Vinnytsia and Dnipropetrovsk Oblasts.

This program seeks to provide mobile support services for veterans who cannot travel or who live in remote areas in the Kyiv, Vinnytsia and Dnipropetrovsk regions. This program is run by Veteran Hub in Ukraine, supported by Help Us Help and IREX, an international not-for-profit education and development organization.



Research Project

This Summer, Help Us Help conducted a research project evaluating the programming that the charity supports through Veteran Hub. The research project, currently under review, consisted of a literature review, evaluating global trends in veteran support, and interviews with veterans and support staff at Veteran Hub. The purpose of the study was to evaluate the effectiveness of the programming we support in Ukraine and to identify areas of improvement.

2021 Veterans Forum

Help Us Help Board Member and Veteran Committee Chair, Andrew Potichnyj, travelled to Ukraine to represent Help Us Help, as a Veteran Hub partner, in the 2021 Veterans Forum hosted by the Ministry of Veteran Affairs of Ukraine. The two-day conference discussed the current needs of Ukrainian veterans, and focused on the following key themes:

- Rehabilitation, Reintegration and Social Adaptation
- Veteran Business
- Veterans' role in the case of possible future conflict escalation
- Emphasis on acknowledging the 26,000 female veterans on an equal plane with their male counterparts
- How can we unify the thousands of current veteran organizations in Ukraine
- Value of peer to peer services and service providers
- How can the ministry best serve and collaborate with veterans

Although not an official theme of the forum, many veterans voiced their concerns on difficulties with follow through on their entitlement to land under Ukrainian law. Forums such as these help our charity to best understand the evolving and current needs of veterans in Ukraine. We would like to thank Veteran Hub and the Ministry of Veteran Affairs of Ukraine for inviting Andrew to take part in this educational conference.



FUNDRAISERS

Easter Fundraiser

In April 2021, Help Us Help hosted an Easter fundraiser. The first 25 people who made a donation of \$100.00 or more to Help Us Help received a one-of-a-kind pysanka, full of love, handmade by campers aged 8-18 years at Help Us Help's 2019 Summer Camp. A total of \$3,950.00 was raised for Help Us Help programming.



Second Annual Independent Move-A-Thon

To prioritize the safety of the children, volunteers and staff, Help Us Help hosted the 2021 Second Independent Move-A-Thon in place of Help Us Help's Annual Ruslana's Summer Camp. Five teams of community members from Canada and Ukraine participated in a variety of activities to fundraise for Help Us Help's programming for vulnerable populations of Ukraine. A total of \$16,003 was raised.

In addition, children who would normally attend our Summer Camp participated in a day full of fun activities and sports organized by Ukrainian Help Us Help volunteers. This was a wonderful opportunity for children to keep fit, active, and healthy during the pandemic.



12-Hour PTSD Solo Cycle

Help Us Help's Board Member and Veterans'
Program Director, Andrew Potichnyj, cycled solo
for 12 hours non-stop in support of PTSD
Awareness. Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder
(PTSD) Awareness Day is recognized annually
on June 27. In the week leading up to his 12hour cycle on June 27th, Andrew raised funds
for Help Us Help Programming that supports
veterans and other vulnerable populations in
Ukraine, many of whom are living with PTSD.
This fundraising campaign raised \$48,205! Help
Us Help is extremely grateful to our top donors,
Dr. Marie Bountrogianni and The Ihnatowycz
Family Foundation.



Christmas Wish Campaign

Due to the ongoing restrictions of the COVID-19 pandemic, Help Us Help was unable to host an in-person annual Winter Camp this holiday season. Its replacement, the Christmas Wish Campaign, consisted of 4 wishes, raising a total of \$57,595! In turn, Help Us Help pledged to:

- 1. Grant NASHI's wish of a transport vehicle and educational materials for at-risk girls living in the NASHI Safe-House.
- 2. Support Vitaliy and Olena to grant the wish of a safe and functional home to foster a group of Ukraine's vulnerable children.
- 3. Grant the wish of a Winter Camp 2022 Replacement Program for children living in Ukraine's residential institutions. This initiative will be implemented by our Scholars.
- 4. Grant the wish for a third "Mobile Support Services for Veterans" vehicle!

FINANCIAL

The Temerty Endowment Fund

Despite the effects of the ongoing pandemic, the 2021 financial statements show growth in support for the recipients of our programs. But we know there is much more work to be done. The Help Us Help Endowment Fund and ongoing Endowment Campaign will ensure we can meet the challenges that lie ahead.

During 2021, the Temerty Foundation—established by James and Louise Temerty—fulfilled their commitment of a leading gift of \$10 million, of which \$9,000,000 initiated our permanent Endowment Fund. This most generous gift provides a solid base for an Endowment Campaign that is committed to raising \$20 million over five years. The resulting \$20 million Help Us Help Endowment Fund will provide a dependable source of administrative and program funding for orphaned and institutionalized children, veterans and other charitable activities as defined in our Business Plan.
